







Why Do Older Adults Fall?

- Common causes of falls include both internal and external risk factors:

External Factors – Your Surroundings

- Hard or slippery surfaces
- Glaring or dim lighting
- Clutter
- Stairs/steps
- Insufficient grab bars
- Throw rugs
- Wires or cords
- Bed/furniture height
- Toilet height
- Poor furniture placement
- Animals

"Bloodborne Pathogens" are microorganisms such as viruses or bacteria that are present in human blood and that can cause disease in humans.

These pathogens include, but are not limited to:

- Hepatitis B (HBV)
- Hepatitis C (HCV)
- Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV)
- Malaria
- Syphilis
- West Nile Virus


